NEWS FROM THE BLUE RIDGE HEALTH DISTRICT Guidelines for People Who Test Positive for COVID-19:

- Stay home.
- Monitor your symptoms. If you have an emergency warning sign (including trouble breathing), seek emergency medical care immediately.
- Stay in a separate room from other household members whenever possible.
- Use a separate bathroom whenever possible.
- Avoid physical contact with other members of the household.
- Avoid sharing personal household items, like cups, towels, and utensils.
- Wear a mask if you must enter shared spaces within the home.
- Inform your contacts (the people you have been around) of your positive status.

Guidelines for Close Contacts:

If you are <u>unvaccinated</u> and a close contact of a positive case:

-The safest option is to quarantine for 14 days after your most recent exposure. Even if you test negative within that time frame, continue quarantining. There are options for reduced quarantine for people experiencing logistical or financial hardship.

- If no symptoms occur, we recommend testing between 5-7 days after the last date of a known exposure.
- Test immediately if symptoms do occur.

If you are <u>vaccinated</u> and a close contact of a positive case:

- Vaccinated individuals are not required to quarantine, but should look out for symptoms for 14 days after contact and seek testing if symptoms occur.

- If no symptoms occur, we recommend testing between 3-5 days after a known exposure when available.
- If symptoms occur, test immediately.

Employers and schools may have a different quarantine or return to work/school policy. Please consult with your employer or children's school for more information.

Register to vote !!

- Please check that you are registered to vote, <u>at your correct address</u>, by going to: <u>https://www.elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/</u>
- or by calling the Voter Registration office at: (434) 972-4173.
- The DEADLINE to register to vote is October 12, 2021.
- But <u>PLEASE DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE</u> !!!

Mail-In Early Voting !!

- · Voters may Apply for a Mail-In ballot now !
- Under new Virginia Law, voters no longer need an Absentee Excuse to Vote Early.
- Applications DEADLINE is October 22, 2021. Do not wait until the last minute !
- The Voter Registration office sends out mail-in ballots to those that have already applied beginning September 17th.
- Mail-in ballots must be postmarked on or before November 2, 2021, and be received by the Voter Registration office before noon on Friday, November 5th.
- Voters are STRONGLY ENCOURAGED to send their mail-in ballots as early as possible to avoid possible mail and processing delays.

Early In-Person Voting !!

- Early in-person voting at the 5th Street Voter Registration Office 1600 5th Street -begins on Friday, September 17th
- M W F 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tuesdays 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Thursdays 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Sat., Oct 23 and Sat. Oct. 30, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Under new Virginia Law, voters no longer need an Absentee Excuse to Vote Early.
- Saturday, October 30 Last day to vote Early In-Person.

Voting At The Polls On Election Day !!

- All Albemarle County polling places are scheduled to be open on Election Day, November 2, 2021, from 6 AM to 7 PM
- County election officers will be wearing masks, and observing Covid 19 procedures to reduce health risks to voters. Voters will be asked to wear masks, and to maintain social distancing.
- New voter photo ID law allows more types of voter IDs at the polls (and for In- Person Early Voting). A photo ID is no longer required. If a voter cannot present an acceptable form of ID the voter will be permitted to vote after signing an Affirmation of Identity.

Invasive Alert: Please help!

An invasive insect called the **Spotted Lanternfly** has been discovered in Albemarle County along the Rivanna River. The Spotted Lanternfly is an agricultural pest that attacks over 70 species of trees and is a significant threat to vineyards and orchards.

"Early detection is really important – the sooner we can identify new locations, the sooner we can enlist professionals to trap and control the insects, and hopefully contain the outbreak. This could significantly slow down the spread of the insects and help mitigate impacts to natural resources and our local economy," said Albemarle County Natural Resources Manager Kim Biasiolli.
