Do you have a well, spring or cistern?

Learn about your water quality through affordable, confidential testing and become empowered to make decisions about system maintenance and water treatment!

The goal of the Virginia Household Water Quality Program is to improve the water quality and health of Virginians with private water supplies, including wells, springs and cisterns.

How does it work?

- Pick up your sample kit near the local Extension office with physical distancing measures.
- Collect samples on designated date and drop off locally (physical distancing measures will be in place and masks are required).
- Samples are analyzed at Virginia Tech. <u>All participant information is kept strictly confidential</u>.
 Receive your confidential results, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing any problems via email (or USPS mall if an email is not provided). A live video or recorded video presentation will also be available to help you understand your results.

Renew Your Real Estate Tax Relief by April 1, 2022

Albemarle County offers real estate tax relief to elderly and/or permanently disabled persons. If you received tax relief last year, you must file your application or certification renewal by April 1 to determine your eligibility prior to the June 25, 2022 real estate tax bills.

You may qualify if:

- · You were the owner of record as of January 1, 2022.
- As of December 31, 2021, you were either (a) at least 65 years of age and/or (b) certified as totally and permanently disabled and
- Your combined total income (from all sources) for 2021 was no more than \$69,452 and
- The combined total net worth of you and your spouse did not exceed \$200,000 as of December 31, 2021

Background:

In 2016, the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors adopted a change that allows property owners who have been determined to be eligible for tax relief to renew their *Tax Relief Application* on a three-year cycle, but applicants must submit an easy-to-complete *Annual Renewal Certification* in each of the two subsequent years. As long as no qualifying criteria has changed from the previous Relief Application that would cause the applicant to be ineligible, tax relief will be renewed.
