He has been writing about life growing up here for years. He has finally given in as many suggested he gather his reminiscences into a book. Congratulations on that accomplishment. He is the founder of the Albemarle High School Alumni Assoc which boasts many local members and serves to gather our classmates from far and wide, digitally and for in person gatherings.

Susan Sherman of the Charlottesville Free Clinic will introduce their programs at the March 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. She sends this note as background.

*Did you know that every day in Albemarle County, thousands of people are forced to decide between putting food on the table for their family or filling a prescription? Paying rent or seeking emergency dental treatment? No one in our community should ever be forced to make those decisions. For 30 years, the Charlottesville Free Clinic has provided the highest-quality healthcare to low-income, uninsured and underinsured individuals—at no cost to them. We provide on-site primary care, mental health services, prescription medication, vision services, dental care and a dozen specialty clinics—like gynecology, dermatology, cardiology and orthopedics—for upwards of 3,000 patients a year. We are neighbors helping neighbors: our streamlined staff is supported by a robust cadre of 500+ volunteers: physicians, nurses, dentists and pharmacists who work their day jobs and then come to the Free Clinic to treat our patients, without passing on costs. This is what health equity looks like: our low-income, uninsured community members receive the same standard of care as their insured, higher-income neighbors.*

*The Free Clinic is also a critical training ground for tomorrow’s healthcare professionals. Each year, we provide training and mentorship to hundreds of pre-medical, pharmacy and dental students, where they get to see healthcare from a very different perspective.*

*Please join us on March 16 when leaders from the Charlottesville Free Clinic will facilitate a conversation on their greatest challenges and most exciting opportunities.*

The next special commercial hazardous waste collection day at the Ivy Materials Utilization Center will be held on:

Qualifying businesses\* must register with MXI Environmental by April 17th to obtain an appointment. To Register, call or email Peggy Snead at (276) 628-6636, extension 203 or [peggys@mxinc.com](mailto:peggys@mxinc.com)." There is a fee associated with disposal.

\*This event is only open to qualifying Albemarle County and City of Charlottesville Businesses and commercial establishments. Qualifications are defined by federal law to include businesses that (1) generate no more than 100 kilograms (220 pounds) hazardous waste in a month, (2) generate no more than 1 kilogram (2.2 pounds) acutely hazardous waste in a month, and (3) store not more than 1,000 kilograms (2,200 pounds) hazardous waste.

**Amnesty Days are free and available only to residents of Albemarle County, Charlottesville and Town of Scottsville.**

Household Appliances Include Only: refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, stoves, furnaces, water heaters, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, heat pumps, microwaves, toasters.

No oversized tires will be accepted.

Normal tipping fees will be charged to residents for all non-amnesty items brought on these days. Also, please note the Ivy facility will accept all above items during normal operation. Contact RSWA (295-3306) regarding tipping fees for the above items..These events are held each fall and spring. If these times do not work for your schedule, please check back for future dates.
