EARLYSVILLE EXCHANGE 2014-2024

In 2014 the long-range planning team of Chestnut Grove Baptist Church, began to consider ways it could address some of the needs in the Earlysville area. Since the local grocery store closed, there was no community center. They decided there needed to be place to address the following needs.

- 1. A safe gathering place, (coffee, chat, and books)
- 2. A local place to volunteer
- 3. A place to provide employment and work training opportunities
- 4. A place to recycle slightly used goods and resale at a good price
- 5. A place to provide financial assistance to local non-profits, i.e., food pantries, shelters, medical clinic, Hospice, etc.
- 6. A place to help with supplies for school children, fire victims, homeless shelters and refuges

Since opening in Nov. 2014, the Earlysville Exchange has given back to the community over \$350,000 in cash and goods to the various local non-profits, and people in need.

October 23 -26 the Earlysville Exchange will celebrate 10 years serving the community.

Come and join in the celebration. There will be great sales and food. CYK 99.7 Will be live 12-2 P.M. at the EE, on Saturday October 26.

(Note: Chestnut Grove Baptist Church receives no money from the Exchange)

Free Together <u>Livingfree2gether.org</u> is dedicated to enriching our community by enhancing the lives of military veterans, first responders and their family members through various ongoing programs and opportunities. Ruck the Ridge is a unique adventure experience which brings the community together, challenges participants to work together, and celebrates their personal and shared victories.

Participants choose from multiple routes that are perfect for trail running and hiking. In celebration of all abilities and in partnership with ARC of the Piedmont, we are offering an additional "all abilities" course on more even terrain. As before, all participants can participate individually or as a team, choose their course length and whether to wear a ruck (weighted backpack).

Celebrating 15 Years of the Buck Mountain Food Pantry

In September 2009, the Buck Mountain Food Pantry opened its doors for the first time. As we look back on the impact we've made in the community thus far, consider these numbers from the last full five years alone (2019-2023):

- Families served: 5,759
 14,263 adults
 6,881 children under 17
- Pounds of food ordered from the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank: 128,700
 Plus many thousands of pounds of food provided by donors or bought by our volunteer shoppers.
- Hours volunteered: 30,000 or more

The Food Pantry is an all-volunteer-run organization that relies on the church to provide the building, utilities, and a small amount of staff assistance (like a few hours a month from our administrative assistant).




