Albemarle County 2025 Reassessment Completed

ALBEMARLE COUNTY, VA - Albemarle County announced today the results of the annual reassessment process. The County's total tax base increased by 5.1% over the 2024 year-end tax base due to the reassessment. The 2025 residential assessment changes are the result of continued appreciation in the housing market despite the increase in mortgage interest rates. Commercial assessment changes varied by property type but experienced an averaged decrease of 1.8%.

Each year, as part of the routine assessment process, County staff inspects approximately 20% of county properties. This year, staff completed detailed reviews of over 10,000 properties. Individual neighborhoods and sections of the county change at different rates so assessments of individual properties will vary from the overall average.

On January 24, notices will be mailed to taxpayers. The 2025 assessment data will also be available online through the <u>County's GIS-Web</u> beginning on January 26.

Overall, taxable assessment changes by property type for 2025 are:

- Urban Residential (County Water & Sewer): +6.9%
- Residential up to 20 acres: +7.3%
- Rural (20 to 99.99 acres): +5.2%
- Rural (100 acres and over): +3.8%
- Commercial Properties: -1.8%
- Multi-Family: -4.0%

Average annual reassessment changes by magisterial district are:

- Rio: +3.3%
- Jack Jouett: +4.8%
- Rivanna: +5.8%
- Samuel Miller: +7.8%
- Scottsville: +3.4%
- Town of Scottsville: +6.1%
- White Hall: +5.1%

The first half 2025 real estate tax bills that are mailed in May will be based on the 2025 reassessment value and the 2025 tax rate that will be adopted by the Board of Supervisors in May. 
Appeals

There are two appeal processes, an administrative review and Board of Equalization appeal. It is recommended that property owners contact the Assessor's office first to find out information about their assessment. Then, if necessary, the administrative review process can be initiated by filing the <u>Administrative</u> <u>Review form</u>, which will be available online, January 24 through February 28. The Administrative Review form must be filed by February 28. The Board of Equalization appeal can be filed by contacting the assessor's office for an application that must be submitted by March 30, or 30 days after the results of an Administrative Review, whichever is later.

Land Use Taxation Program

The land use deadline structure has changed this year. The initial period to apply for 2025 ended on January 1, 2025. If the notice mailed on January 24 indicates an increase in market land assessment or a parcel was newly created for 2025, then the Assessor's Office will accept an application for qualifying properties to enter the Land Use Tax Deferral Program, with the \$125 application fee, through February 24. A new application is required for each parcel to enroll in the program. The application fee is non-refundable, so contact the Assessor's Office for assistance in advance if needed.

If you miss the February 24 deadline, you may apply with another \$125 fee per parcel before April 24, 2025.


