The Food Pantry Needs Your Support!



Founded in 2009, the Buck Mountain Episcopal Church Food Pantry provides emergency food and other household necessities on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. for people in need. We are supported by several area churches including Chestnut Grove Baptist Church, Union Ridge Baptist, and Rivanna Community Church, as well as the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Earlysville Exchange, Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, and local residents, gardeners, and businesses. We have over 20 volunteers from our church and the community. We serve an average of 50 families per distribution with increased numbers in the fall and winter, especially at Thanksgiving, when we provide all the fixings for a traditional turkey dinner. Unlike many food pantries, we also distribute household necessities such as diapers, toilet paper, feminine hygiene supplies, laundry detergent, and pet food.

Families fill out a grocery form and our volunteers bring the groceries to their car. The Blue Ridge Area Food Bank requires three pieces of information, which are kept confidential: the name of the household, their address, and age. There are no income, status, or demographic questions. While operated by Buck Mountain Episcopal Church, the Food Pantry volunteers welcome all and do not proselytize.

With recent cuts to government food assistance programs and with inflation in food costs, the Food Pantry will soon need increased support from our generous community. While the church provides space, utilities, volunteers, and oversight for the Food Pantry, we depend on our neighbors for funding. As a small church, we cannot do it alone!

A quick google search will take you to the FTC website and many options.

If you get an unwanted text message, there are three ways to report it:

- Copy the message and <u>forward it</u> to 7726 (SPAM). This helps your wireless provider spot and block similar messages in the future.
- Report it on the messaging app you use. Look for the option to report junk or spam.




